Ajilon's winning streak continues

in the coveted WAIITTA Awards

Perth 25 June 2014: Ajilon, one of Australia's largest resourcing, business and technology companies, won the Government category in the 23rd WAIITTA Western Australian Information Technology and Telecommunications Awards for the development of the first system in Australia to implement integrated prosecution, bail management and court booking through a single application.

Commissioned by the Western Australia Police (WAPOL), the *Police Justice Information Exchange* provides all involved agencies (WA Police, Director of Public Prosecutions and Departments of the Attorney General and Corrective Services) with a 'single source of truth' about a defendant's passage through the justice system.

Managing Director at Ajilon, Ger Doyle, said "Our core vision for the company and for our clients focuses on being courageous, pragmatic, caring and agile and each of our shortlisted projects encompasses these from concept through to delivery.

"I'm very proud of the innovative and successful work our teams produce in partnership with fantastic clients and to be recognised as a finalist is a great achievement".

Ajilon had another two projects as finalists in the Government category at WAIITTA, both of which were just pipped at the post by Ajilon's *Police Justice Information Exchange* project.

[Check My Crime](#), another WAPOL and Ajilon project, enables WA residents to check the status of their own property related incident reports and upload stolen or damaged property onto existing incident reports.

Locate, an Ajilon, Landgate and NGIS project was also a finalist in the Government category. An Australian first, the Locate website and Shared Location Information Platform couples Google Earth technology with government spatial and other data to provide public access to current and historical views of a wide range of demographic, land, infrastructure, health, fire and other information.

In 2013, Ajilon and WAPOL won the WA Information Technology and Telecommunications Awards (WAIITTA) for their development of the Public Sex Offenders Register (PSOR) system in addition to a merit award for their development of the Immediate Disqualification Notice (IDN) system.
